

# DRESDEN PLATE WORKSHOP

## Supply List

The Dresden Plate quilt design has been around for many years, and continues to be popular because of its ease and ability to combine many fabrics, often as a “scrappy” project. In class you will make at least two blocks, one “plate” with rounded ends and one with pointed ends. Both finish with some simple applique stitches. I also hope to share the “split” and 45 degree wide Dresden. If you want to make a table topper or table runner you will get a good start making your “blocks” in class!

Bring: Sewing machine with power cord and foot control

-standard sewing foot

-1/4” foot

-Open toe foot

-Minimum of 4 co-ordinating fabrics, at least a fat quarter of each

\*\*more fabric is fun--co-ordinated or scrappy. If you have a bigger project in mind be sure to have more fabric ready!

-2 Fat quarters for the background—or 1 yard for larger project

-Piecing thread and bobbin (cotton preferred)

-50# cotton thread to match fabrics plus a slight contrast for applique

-Creative Grid Dresden Ruler -has angle “plate” and center circle

-1 yard fusible web (Heat & Bond Lite, Trans Web etc)

-Rotary cutter and ruler-sharp blade

-1 yard stabilizer (tear away)

-Point turner tool

I have several patterns using different “wedge degree” templates that you are welcome to use!
