1/2 HEXAGON WITH STRIPOLOGY RULER

Let's Fall in Love With Hexagons

Learn how to cut $\frac{1}{2}$ hexagons in 4 different sizes. This is a great stash busting project and no Y seams! I have a few examples of what can be made or I can guide you with your own creation. There are so many variations to play with!

Have your fabric ironed. If you like to starch that will help, we will be working with bias edges. Yardage is best, but fat quarters will work.

SUPPLIES

- *Stripology XL ruler*
- *GEasy Point Trimmers*
- *rotary cutter with new blade*
- *fabric*
- *sewing machine with all cords*
- *basic sewing supplies*

HIGHLY RECOMMENDED

- *Numbered pins to mark your rows. I like Gypsy Quilter ABC 123 Pins.*
- *large wonder clips to hold rows together*
- *GEasy Stickers*



If you have room, bring your own cutting mat!

CHRISTMAS TREE QUILT

with 6 inch hexagons

- *brown - 4" x 20" scrap*
- *light green - ½ yard*
- *dark green - ½ yard*
- *white - 1 ½ yards*
- *binding - ½ yard*



RED WHITE AND BLUE QUILT

with 6 inch hexagons

- *red - ¾ yard*
- *blue - ¾ yard*
- *multi - ¾ yard*
- *white - 1 yard*
- *blue border and binding - 1 ¼ yards*
