

WOOL APPLIQUE PROJECT

Supply List for Sept 17, 2026

Planning for this class has been so much fun, and again, I have two designs available, one is easier with less pieces, and the other is very busy with more pieces—both are holiday designs-. For both I recommend paying for class and then I can give you the “pattern” page so that you can trace the design shapes onto fusible web to save time. In class then you will fuse them onto the wool and cut them out. If you have a pattern of your own and your own wools you could prepare for class that way.

I will provide the wools and threads to use in the classroom for the designs, for a small kit fee (wool is expensive!) If you have not done any applique at all, be prepared to do some practice before starting the project. Practicing your decorative stitches is great.

Bring: Sewing machine (not embroidery) with power cord and foot control

- Open toe foot
- Lightweight bobbin filled—such as embroidery bobbin
- 30 to 40 weight threads if you have some—don’t worry over this
- Topstitch #14 needle (has larger eye and sharp point)
- Fusible web—HotFix or Heat & Bond light recommended
- Fine point sharpie to trace patterns
- Light box if you have one—I have several in the classroom
- Background fabric—felt or heavier cotton in your color choice
- Stabilizer—Tear Away or **Fuse ‘n Fleece** (OESD) -we carry this
- Really sharp scissors—Karen Kay Buckley are wonderful
- Applique Press sheet **Important!!! for assembly



For the tree-it can be “free standing” or appliqued to background

You would need: red wool 10 ½” tall plus backing

white for snowman, textured white for snow, green plaid for trees, black hat, scarf, textured red candy cane, gold hat band, and brown wool trunk --all available in my closet!

For the stocking—it is free standing so needs wool for the front and the back (red plaid shown) white for cuff, green for heel and toe.

For both, try to have the patterns traced ahead ready to cut and fuse (available at the register in August)
